WHEREAS, the Borough of Longport wishes to enter into a Rider to the Shared Services Agreement contract dated 12/18/2008 with the ACUA under which the ACUA is to provide Solid Waste, Bulky Waste, Recycling, and collection services for its residents which Rider extends the current contract thru 12/31/2012 and amends certain provisions of the existing contract; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40:14B-49 empowers municipalities and municipal utilities authorities to enter into contracts for the collection, disposal and treatment of solid waste by means of the solid waste system of the municipal utilities authority, which term includes recycling facilities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Longport Board of Commissioners that the Commissioner of Public Works, Parks and Public Property, James P. Leeds, Sr., be and is hereby authorized to enter into a Rider to the 12/18/2008 contract with the Atlantic County Utilities Authority to perform certain collection services for the period of January 1, 2012 to December 31, 2012.



SECTION II: The salaries of all officials and employees of the Borough shall be paid on a bi-weekly basis with the exception of those salaries paid *not less than quarterly* so as to conform with pension reporting procedures.


SECTION III: Each full-time employee, except for those employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement or a management contract shall receive longevity pay, according to and in compliance with the Borough of Longport Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual and Employee Handbook, in addition to their regular salary.

SECTION IV: Firefighters and Emergency Medical Technicians (EMT) may receive a stipend. The Fire Chief shall develop criteria for payment of an annual stipend to certain Firefighters /EMT's of the Longport Volunteer Fire Department. Those criteria shall be presented to the Director of Public Safety and Public Affairs on an annual basis for the Director's approval. In no event shall any such stipend paid by the Borough of Longport in accordance with this ordinance be considered as salary or other remuneration. The payments set forth herein shall not be considered salary, nor shall such payments be considered to in any way construe the creating of a paid or partially paid fire department or ambulance squad with the Borough of Longport. No person receiving such stipend shall be considered by virtue of that stipend alone an employee of the Borough. Payment of stipends are subject to production of adequate documentation of current certification. No individual may receive fire department stipends totaling more than \$1,500.

SECTION V: All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

2.15.2012

WORKSHOP SESSION – CALLED TO ORDER with the reading of the Open Public Meeting Notice.
In attendance: Mayor Nicholas Russo, Commissioner Dan Lawler, Deputy Clerk Strawder, Solicitor Agnellini, Engineer Carter and CFO Kelly
Not in attendance: Municipal Clerk Hiltner and Commissioner James P. Leeds, Sr.

Mayor Russo asked Richard Carter for an update on the water tower repair/repaint. The contractor is obviously taking his time to complete the project. The interior of the tower is done with the exterior still to be started. Discussion ensued between the Mayor, the Solicitor, Mr. Carter and Commissioner Lawler on what can be done legally to get the contractor to complete the contract. It was decided that Mr. Agnellini would write a letter asking the contractor a time frame of when the project can be completed.

The Mayor then discussed the LONGPORT THE BEST PORT vs. a suggestion that a resident submitted of LONGPORT FOR SHORE. Mr. Carter stated that LONGPORT THE BEST PORT was already in the contract.

The Mayor stated that the ACUA is selling a recyclable can for \$55 that has a lid, wheels, ID that will identify the owner of the can. A sample of this can is in the hallway of Borough Hall.

The Mayor mentioned that the Borough has a CNG Honda (Compressed Natural Gas) on loan from the ACUA for one week. He has recommended that the Building Dept use the vehicle during that time. Basically, the vehicle is nice, however no trunk space due to the natural gas tank.

WITH NO FURTHER BUSINESS TO DISCUSS, COMMISSIONER LAWLER MADE MOTION TO ADJOURN THE WORKSHOP SESSION AND SECONDED BY MAYOR RUSSO.

Minutes for 1.18.12 Commission Meeting- Commissioner Lawler made motion to approve the minutes of the Jan. 18, 2012 meeting and seconded by Mayor Russo. MOTION APPROVED.

O2012-01 –AUTHORIZING THE SALARIES, WAGES, AND COMPENSATION IN YEAR 2012 FOR EMPLOYEES NOT COVERED BY PREVIOUS ORDINANCES OR UNION CONTRACTS (1ST READING/INTRODUCTION) 2ND READING SCHEDULED FOR MARCH 21ST.

Commissioner Lawler made motion to approve the 1st reading of O2012-01 and seconded by Mayor Russo. MOTION APPROVED

Mayor Russo read a resolution submitted by Jann Cohen, Board Secretary, Longport Board of Education into record (see attached)

Motion by Tripician, seconded by Affanato, affirmed by a roll call vote of Tripician and Affanato, the Longport Board of Education passed the following resolution:

Whereas Public Law 2011, Chapter 202 provides that a local school district may adopt a resolution to eliminate the vote on its annual school budget that is within the statutory cap imposed by the State of New Jersey, and

Whereas the above legislation provides that the above action would require districts to hold their annual election for school board members in November during the regular general election, and

Whereas, the Longport Board of Education has determined that the statutory restrictions on the local levy tax increase for annual school appropriations is appropriate and sufficient to control and maintain a thorough and efficient education for the children of Longport, and

Whereas, the Longport Board of Education, consistent with the budgetary restrictions expressed above, believes that dispensing with annual school budget votes will save taxpayer dollars, and

Whereas, the Longport Board of Education believes that school board member elections in November will attract a far greater number of voters than typically vote in April elections, and

Whereas, the Longport Board of Education believes that the elimination of the vote on the school budget and the movement of the board member election to November is in the best interest of the community, and

Whereas, the Longport Board of Education understands that this decision shall remain in effect for a minimum of four years,

Now Therefore Be It Resolved, that the Longport Board of Education does hereby determine that it will eliminate the vote on its annual school budget which shall be within the statutory cap and become effective for the 2012-13 budget, and

Be It Further Resolved, that the Longport Board of Education does hereby determine that the election of school board members will occur at the annual general election in November, 2012.

Mayor Russo stated that this is a clerical error and it is only right for government to correct the error.

Commissioner Lawler made motion to pass R2012-16 and seconded by Mayor Russo. Motion approved.

BILL PAY LIST/FINANCIAL REPORT SUMMARY- Commissioner Lawler read the Financial Report into record. The audience was asked if there were any questions regarding the bill pay list. With no questions or concerns from those in attendance, Commissioner Lawler made motion to approve the Bill Pay List and Financial Report. Motion seconded by Mayor Russo. MOTION APPROVED.

COMMISSIONERS' REPORTS

Mayor Russo stated that it was brought to his attention that the Borough employees have never worked during a municipal election. Deputy Clerk Strawder was asked to prepare a revised Holiday resolution for the next meeting.

Mayor Russo also stated that he wrote a letter of commendation to Commissioner Leeds citing Bill Trinkle, Chuck Simmons, Chris Berenotto and Jim Eichner for staying extra hours to monitor the pumps while the water tower was refilled.

The Mayor also wrote a letter of gratitude to Peter Ciarrocchi of Chickie & Pete's for the sponsorship of the January Senior Luncheon. Today's Senior Luncheon was sponsored by Premier Properties and they were also thanked for their participation in the Luncheon program.

Feb. 3rd- the Borough participated in "Wear Red for Women" Day by wearing red Borough sweatshirts. The day ended in a CPR class for all employees.

March 6th- Turner brick dedication at the Veteran's Memorial. A brief description of the heroic rescue attempt was read by the Mayor.

The Borough received a "Safety Excellence" award from the Atlantic County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund.

The ACUA is selling the recyclable cart of wheels, lid, extra large with ID attached to it for easy retrieval. The can is displayed in the hall and will sell at \$55. Will be actively selling them on Earth Day, April 27th.

Bruce Funk has informed the Mayor that the goal for the Town Clock has been reached. The clock will be delivered sometime in April. The Mayor would like the Clock committee gather together by the Clock "goal" sign for a photo. Estimates have not been obtained yet on the setting for the installation of the clock due to numerous companies being involved. Mr. Carter will have a report for the next meeting.

Commissioner Lawler had nothing to report

PUBLIC COMMENT

Murray Bevit, 15 S Colgate Ave, had several matters to discuss.

- 1) Define "non pro tunc" as stated in the ACUA resolution. Mr. Agnellini informed him that it is "now if not then" when a resolution is passed after the agreement has expired.
- 2) Election day "holiday" should be negotiated amongst the employees who should consider giving up another holiday i.e. Day after Thanksgiving. Holidays are continually added to the list and the Borough has to pay for this.
- 3) Water tank issue- his neighbors have contacted plumbers to find out about water stains and brown water.

With no further comments from the audience, Commissioner Lawler made motion to adjourn the regular session of the Commission Meeting for Feb. 15, 2012. Motion was seconded by Mayor Russo. MOTION APPROVED.
