Want to Learn More about How you Can Help Conserve Water? Then the 'Save Water, Every Drop Counts!' display is for you.



The display, created by the Rutgers Cooperative Extension of Ocean County, helps residents reduce their daily consumption of water and ensure plentiful supplies in the future and is currently on display inside Longport Borough Hall located at 2305 Atlantic Avenue. The display has been created to help educate residents on water consumption and share practices that can be used to conserve water.

The display consists of a slideshow playing on a digital picture frame securely mounted onto a rain barrel (non-functional). The slideshow provides information outlining what people can do every day to save water at home. A flyer accompanies the display so that people who view it can take the information and start work at saving water at home.

With over 9 million people live in New Jersey and each person using about 70 gallons of water per day, we have the chance to work to save part of 630 million gallons per day used in our everyday activities.
